



What is KYB4M?

Know Your Bible For Men and Mixed Groups is a ministry using material produced by CWCI.

KYB4M is managed and promoted by a Leadership Team who are all volunteers.

KYB studies distributed by KYB4M are designed to help men and mixed groups to know God's Word and its message for today through personal study and group sharing.

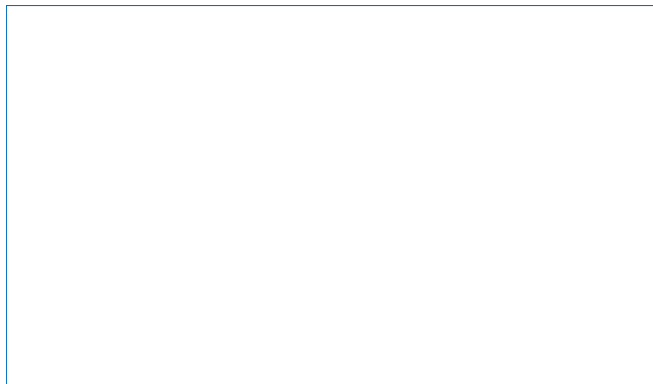
The studies are designed so that members have the passage of Scripture brought to them in four ways each week:

- 1 At home answering the daily questions.
- 2 In group discussion.
- 3 By the leader's summary after the discussion.
- 4 In the printed notes given at the end of each unit.

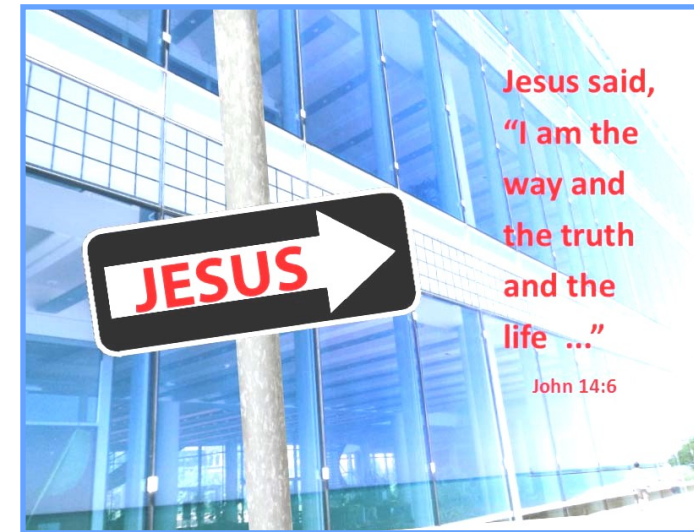
Some benefits of study with the Know Your Bible method are:

- A daily devotional pattern is established for each person and all are nurtured by God's Word.
- Discussion leaders are trained and equipped for further service to God.
- KYB4M Leaders are stimulated to study and become more effective teachers of the Word.

What is the KYB4M method?

Four KYB studies are offered each year.

The first three usually contain an introduction and nine weekly units. The fourth usually contains an introduction and five weekly units. All weekly groups use the same study.

Each person in the KYB4M group has a study book. Each unit has a passage of the Bible to read and questions to be answered each day. Each study is prepared using the NIV 2011 translation of the Bible.

For example:

Read Ephesians 2:8-9 *'For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast.'*

Answer the questions:

1. How can we be saved?
2. Is it possible to earn salvation?
3. Give a definition of the word 'grace'.

The answers to the questions are written in the space provided in the study book.

When the KYB4M group meets, the leader introduces the study. They then break into discussion group(s) to share and discuss their answers to the questions. At the close, the leader gives a summary of the study.

How do we start a KYB4M group?

Send an email including your name, and contact phone number to the KYB4M enquiries address. You will be sent a KYB4M Application Pack. Complete and return the forms in this pack.

Once your application has been approved, you will be assisted in the arrangement of your first meeting and the ordering of the study books.



KYB4M group format

It is suggested KYB4M groups meet for one and a half hours. The group should be kept to the times agreed upon so that members will know what is involved time-wise. The following is an example of the timing for a group:

10 minutes	Prayer and Opening segment
1 hour	Discussion time
20 minutes	KYB4M Leader's summary and prayer

It is preferable to meet weekly. However, there are groups that meet fortnightly and function satisfactorily.

Prior to the meeting of the group, if there are more than one discussion leaders they meet together to discuss the answers for the week's unit and pray.

KYB4M Leader

The KYB4M Leader conducts the opening segment and gives the closing summary, orders the KYB4M books and appoints the Discussion Leader(s).

Discussion Leaders

Discussion Leaders lead the discussion groups. A discussion group is most effective when the number involved is between six and ten. The KYB4M Leader may also be a discussion leader.

- An introduction to each study is available on CD or on the website to assist the KYB4M Leader in their preparation.
- For each study a Leader's Book is provided, and for each unit this contains an opening segment, a suggested summary and suggested answers.
- Large print books are available.
- Pastoral support is provided by the Pastoral Carer on the Leadership Team.
